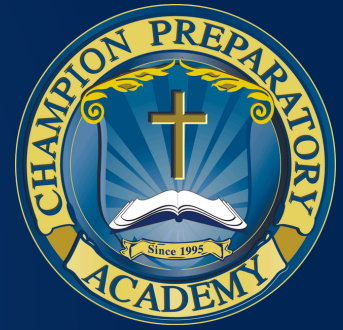

K-2 MONDAY CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Monday is a day of hands-on multi-sensory learning and cooperative learning. Our certified teachers provide a safe, nurturing environment where your child can explore and stretch their talents while building self-confidence and learning to work as a team. Our multi-sensory, project-based learning experiences encourage discovery through teacher-guided investigations, questioning, instruction, hands-on learning, discussion, and teamwork. Classes are integrated and include critical thinking and integration of all subjects.

Bible/Music: Each class will have a time of prayer, Bible lesson, and praise & worship.

Hands-On Science/Math: Students will enjoy hands-on science activities and rotate with math centers with grade level teacher. Math teachers will be reviewing Day School Math.

Living History/Literature Unit: Students will study countries and cultures in history and related literature with many hands-on activities.

Recess: All Students will have a 20-minute break in the morning to play on the playground.

1. **Robotics Coding/STEAM:** (STEAM - Science, Technology, Engineering, Art & Math) Our STEAM LAB will excite and motivate children to love learning. Our lab building is fully equipped with the latest technology: Lego robots, Dot & Dash Robots, 3D Printers, AR & AV Z Space computers, a green screen for streaming projects, new computers, and a kitchen for those ooey, gooey projects.

2. **Music and Movement:** Students will explore rhythm and music topics while also moving and stretching.

3. **Art:** Students will learn basic art skills and develop fine motor skills through various arts and crafts projects.

4. **Life Skills:** Students will focus on learning age-appropriate skills to help at home and for the future using fun, hands-on activities.

Alternative Full Year class: **A Day on Broadway:** (K-5)- This class will hone their acting, dance, and speaking skills while working on a Christ-centered production. Performances will be held in December and May. **Lab Fee \$50.00**

K-2 TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY, AND THURSDAY INFORMATION

The focus on T-W-Th is core academics. All classes meet or exceed Florida Standards. Most academic work is accomplished during their time at school. Students will have some homework each evening, such as reading, sight words, spelling words, math facts, etc. Teachers use the Christ-Centered Bob Jones Curriculum for Math, Language Arts, Phonics, and Readers. Teachers use "The Secret Stories" Phonics class kit as a supplement to the Bob Jones. Students will use IXL Math and Language Arts for individual instruction and practice. Teaching will include whole-class, small-group, individual instruction, centers, and hands-on learning. Teachers use iPads and other resources to enhance the curriculum and to provide engaging, hands-on lessons that the children will enjoy.
