We're excited to introduce a comprehensive middle school program focused on academics, enrichment, hands-on learning, critical thinking, and spiritual growth.

Monday – A Day of Discovery!

We start the week with chapel in the gym, and then we immerse students in hands-on enrichment activities that foster critical thinking, creativity, and exploration. With over ten enrichment classes to choose from, students have the opportunity to pursue their passions while developing new skills.

T-W-Th Middle School Program – These core (English, History, Math, Science) academic days focus on deepening students' understanding through interactive, Christ-centered learning. Our instructors bring lessons to life using project-based learning, technology, and engaging resources that encourage problem-solving and real-world application. Students actively collaborate, think critically, and participate in hands-on activities that make learning meaningful and dynamic. Students in 6th and 7th grade will rotate between two specialty teachers while 8th grade will have four specialty teachers in preparation for High School. Middle school will utilize the Bob Jones curriculum for all subjects.

8th Grade Honors Program – Elevate Your Learning!

Algebra 1 & High School Prep – Take Algebra 1 at the high school level or enroll in all high school core classes to prepare for dual enrollment in 11th and 12th grade based on eligibility.

Friday – Students complete teacher-assigned homework to strengthen skills learned throughout the week.

<p>Lunch: Bring your own lunch & drink Dress Code: Monday & Friday Modified Dress Code T-W-TH: Students need to order school logo shirts with our school logo. (See Dress Code) **Parents Purchase Books by July 31st and bring to Orientation. Please label all books with student name.</p>
<p>Arrival Time: Drop off at the Gym from 8:45 until 9:30 AM. Students arriving after 9:00 AM are considered tardy. After 9:30, please drop off at the school office. Pick-up Time: Students need to be picked up no later than 3:15. After 3:15 there is a \$5.00 charge for every 10 minutes late.</p>
Grades 6-8 MONDAY CLASS DESCRIPTIONS
<p>Monday is a day of hands-on multi-sensory learning and cooperative learning. Our certified teachers provide a safe environment where your student can explore and stretch his talents while building self-confidence and learning to work as a team. Our multi-sensory, project-based learning experiences encourage discovery through teacher-guided investigations, questioning, direct instruction, hands-on learning, discussion, and teamwork. Classes are integrated and include critical thinking and integration of all subjects.</p>
<p>Praise Team: 8:00 AM-9:00 AM</p>
<p>Chapel: Grades 6-12 will come together for a time of prayer, pledge of allegiance to the flag, praise & worship.</p>
<p>Math Classes: Day School students will work on their math skills and homeschool students can get help with their math homework.</p>
<p>Culinary Arts: Students will learn basic cooking skills, nutrition, how to read labels, measurement, safety, and how to clean a kitchen. Lab Fee: \$200.00</p>
<p>Art and Drawing: This is a foundational art course where students will increase their skills using pencil and paper.</p>
<p>Art with the Masters (6-12): A tour through time with the Artistic Masters. From the Impressionists to Pop Art, discover various media like acrylic paint, watercolor, pastels, sculpture, and more...all while looking at famous works with a critical eye.</p>
<p>Mixed Media: This is a foundational art course where students will discover various media like acrylic paint, watercolor, pastels, sculpture, and more.</p>
<p>Everyday Fitness: Fitness is a lifelong journey built upon good decisions at every stage. In this class, students will learn how to make fitness manageable using common items found at home and will learn about making healthy choices and habits that will grow with them.</p>
<p>Ceramics: Explore art through sculpture. Students will work on a variety of projects using clay.</p>
<p>Guitar Music Class: Students will learn the fundamentals of guitar. Additional book purchase and guitar required.</p>
<p>Outdoor PE/Sports: Students will learn various outdoor sports and fitness exercises.</p>
<p>Digital Art/Photography: Using the classic skills of photography in new ways through digital editing and design. Students will need to be able to take photos outside of class as homework and save them to their computers for use in class</p>
<p>*STEAM Lab: Hands-on Learning (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art & Math) Our STEAM LAB will excite and motivate children to love learning. Our lab building is fully equipped with the latest in technology: Lego robots, Dot & Dash Robots, coding, 3D Printers, AR & AV Z Space computers, and a green screen for Zoom or streaming projects. While technology is an integral part of the lab experience there are still many hands-on projects where we will set the technology aside. Lab fee \$50</p>
<p>Acting and Scene Studies: In the fall semester, students will focus on acting techniques and learn how to create believable characters on the stage. In the spring semester, students will enter scene study and apply techniques learned to monologues and 2 person scenes. Parents are required to purchase the following book: Meisner for Teens: A Life of True Acting by Larry Silverberg. Book available on Amazon.</p>
<p>*Creative Explorations & Consumer Science: This course will teach Creative Arts, Science, Homesteading, and Resourceful skills through projects that can be a personal hobby or lead to a professional career. Students will also focus on entrepreneurship using cross-curricular math, science, communication skills, critical thinking and problem-solving. They will plan, design, budget, create packaging with labels, and market their products to sell at our school. Lab Fee: \$75</p>
<p>Newspaper/Journalism: Students will create two editions of Champion Newspaper for students and families, one in December and one for May. Lab fee of \$50</p>
<p>Spanish 1 or 2 (8-12): This class is a high school credit class and may be taken by students' 8th grade and up. There is homework and students will need access to Apex curriculum. Students will need to purchase Apex for a lab fee of \$250.00.</p>
<p>Yearbook: Students will assist with working on layout and design of the school yearbook. Extra hours beyond class time may be required.</p>
<p>Quest for Success: This is a combination of life skills and student success topics including typing and map reading. In this class students will complete missions and side quests to win the game as they navigate through each unit and lesson. They can win, if they complete all tasks.</p>
<p>*Technical and Performance Theater (6-12): For students interested in performing in theater, this class will hone their acting, dance, and speaking skills while working on a major production. The theater production will be held in May. For students interested in the technical aspects of theater, they may choose to learn how to use the sound and lighting equipment instead of doing Theater. Lab Fee: \$100.00 Technical (Elements of Sound and Lighting) is now listed as separate class. They work together with Performance Theater class.</p>
<p>Stock Market Simulation/Finance: Students participate in a hands-on experience where they buy and sell virtual stocks, learning the basics of investing and market dynamics. This engaging environment fosters financial literacy, teamwork, and critical thinking skills as students compete in simulated trading challenges.</p>
<p>Story Lab- The Art of Creative Writing: Story Lab is a creative writing class for middle school students who love stories—or want to learn how to tell their own. Through fun prompts and hands-on activities, students build characters, plots, and confidence while exploring different genres. In a supportive, low-pressure environment, young writers strengthen their writing skills, share ideas, and discover the power of their voice.</p>
<p>Character and Leadership: Students will explore topics related to leadership and character studies with emphasis on Christian Worldview.</p>
<p>In Motion: Athlete Activation: A high-energy morning class designed to wake up the body, prime the nervous system, and build athletic readiness for the day. Start your morning the way athletes start their training — with purposeful movement that builds speed, sharpens coordination, and boosts overall performance. This class blends dynamic warm-ups, speed-ladder work, mini-hurdle drills, calisthenics, and mobility to activate every major muscle group and fire up quick-reaction patterns.</p>
Grades 6-8 TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY, AND THURSDAY INFORMATION

The focus on T-W-Th is core academics. All classes meet or exceed Florida Standards. Most academic work is accomplished during their time at school. Students will have some homework each evening such as reading, writing, math practice, and study for quizzes and exams. Students in grades 6, 7 & 8 will use Christian-based textbooks for all subjects: Math, Language Arts, Science & History. Students in 8th grade may elect to take either Pre-Algebra or Algebra I (*Apex) upon referral by their math teacher. All students in 6th – 12th grades need to provide their own computer which will be used for writing, research, and IXL.

Grades 6-8 FRIDAY INFORMATION 9:00-12:00

Friday is a day of school. If you are not signed up for the Friday on-campus program, the parent will need to supervise the student at home to make sure Friday assignments are completed and ready to turn in by Tuesday. Students in 6-8 should expect to have approximately two and a half hours of assignments on Friday. Friday classes provide teaching staff to help students complete their Friday assignments. Friday students may also attend school field trips instead of being in class. Students are required to complete Friday assignments at home if attending a field trip. Parents transport and supervise students on field trips. Teachers do not attend field trips.

Friday-9:00-12:00-Day School Study Hall (Required for full-time M-F students) Students are excused to attend field trips. Students are required to complete Friday assignments at home if attending a field trip.
