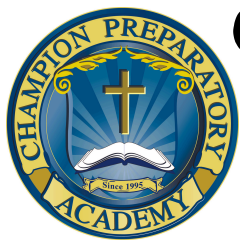

MICROSCHOOL GENERAL INFORMATION

Lunch: Bring your own lunch & drink

Snack: Bring two extra snacks and drinks.

Dress Code: Students need to order school logo shirts and outerwear with logo or without logo. (See Dress Code below)

Arrival Time: Drop off at the Gym 9:20-9:30. After 9:40 AM, you will need to drop off at the school office.

Pick-up Time: Students need to be picked up no later than 2:30. Please park your car and come to the gym for pick-up. This will avoid waiting in the Day School car pick-up line. Pick up at the gym after 2:40. After 2:40, there is a \$5.00 charge for every ten minutes late.

Attendance: Regular attendance is encouraged but not required.

What: Our new non-traditional multi-age level Microschool for K-5 offers specialized academic support for homeschooled students and parents. This program takes us back to our roots as for many years we offered one & two days a week enrollment option. This class includes only Christian homeschool students and does not integrate with the Day School. We understand the challenges of homeschooling and provide encouragement, along with expert instruction in challenging subjects such as language arts and math, and integrated unit studies. Our teacher will provide lesson suggestions for the entire week, ensuring that students receive the support they need to excel in their studies. Parents may choose to support the lessons or do their own curriculum at home. With our dedicated approach, we strive to empower homeschooled students and parents to achieve academic success with confidence.

Teachers will provide a detailed list of units. Each Integrated Unit will take approximately four-six weeks to complete and will include targeted grammar, spelling, writing, art, reading & comprehension, geography, science, social studies, history, Bible, and more lessons. Parents may review and work on the unit at home or let the teacher complete it in class.

Who: Students who are homeschooling in grades K-8 with good behavioral control, who are motivated to learn, and who have attention control that will allow them to complete work in a group setting. Students must be working at or close to grade level.

Curriculum:

Students will complete units and lessons with the campus teacher. Lessons are meant to introduce students to interesting topics and projects to foster a love of learning.

The school provides materials for hands-on activities that we complete at school, occasional worksheets, and projects.

STEAM Lab (6-8)-Students will enjoy robotics, coding, AR/VR, and 3D printing, along with other related projects.

Parent provides:

Handwriting book (your choice)-We recommend A Reason for Handwriting (A/Kindergarten, B-1st grade, T-2nd grade, C- 3rd grade, D- 4th grade, E-5th grade)

Reading/Literature books from BJU Book links for the unit study, 2nd-5th grades. Books TBA

Math curriculum (Your choice)-teachers will provide support for lessons taught at home and will have math centers and games to reinforce math skills.

Parents are responsible for core academic learning

**Book lists and supply lists will be provided on July 1st for all grades and programs.

PEP Scholarship: Champion will assist you in submitting tuition fees directly through your EMA account, ensuring that the payment is made directly to Champion Academy. Registration fees are due at the time of enrollment. Upon payment, Champion will provide a paid invoice, which you can submit to your EMA account for reimbursement. Additionally, any books and materials you purchase may also be eligible for reimbursement. If you enroll for two days a week, the PEP Hybrid program is accepted, and you will be considered a part of our private school.

Dress Code for Wednesday/Thursday Classes**

Champion Academy's uniform policy is designed to promote consistency, modesty, and professionalism among students. The dress code ensures that all students maintain a neat, well-groomed, and appropriate appearance without drawing unnecessary attention.

All tops must be purchased through Lands' End (www.landsend.com; School Code: 900199126).

Boys' Uniform Requirements:

- **Bottoms:** Solid navy, khaki, or black pant, joggers, or walking-length shorts (e.g., Bermuda). No pajama pants, athletic pants, sweatpants, or jogging pants.
- **Tops & Outerwear:** Solid-colored polo shirts with the school's embroidered logo are required. Solid single-colored hoodies and jackets may be worn with or without the school logo. Outerwear may not display graphics; only small brand logos are permitted.
- **Footwear:** Closed-toe and closed-heel shoes (athletic shoes preferred). Ankle or no-show socks are preferred.

Additional Guidelines for Boys:

1. All clothing must fit properly.
2. Pre-existing tattoos must be covered.
3. Hair must be well-groomed, naturally colored, and free of extreme styles (e.g., Mohawks). Facial hair is not permitted.
4. Jewelry is limited to one necklace and one bracelet or watch. No smartwatches are allowed.
5. Clothing that is too tight, too baggy, ripped, torn, or frayed is not allowed.
6. Earrings or other piercings are not permitted.
7. Caps, hats, bandanas, and scarves are not allowed in school.

Girls' Uniform Requirements:

- **Bottoms:** Solid navy, khaki, or black pants, capris, shorts, skirts, or skorts. Shorts, skirts, and skorts must be no more than four inches above the knee for all ages. No pajama pants, athletic pants, sweatpants, stand-alone leggings or yoga pants.
- **Tops & Outerwear:** Solid-colored polo shirts with the school's embroidered logo are required. Solid single-colored hoodies and jackets may be worn with or without the school logo. Outerwear may not display graphics; only small brand logos are permitted.
- **Footwear:** Closed-toe and closed-heel shoes (athletic shoes preferred). Ankle or no-show socks are preferred. Heels must not exceed 1 inch.

Cold Weather Attire (40 degrees and below): Boots may be worn in cold weather. Jeans and Sweatpants may replace uniform pants on these days.

Additional Guidelines for Girls:

1. All clothing must fit properly.
2. Pre-existing tattoos must be covered.
3. Upper-school girls may wear conservative-colored nail polish and light makeup.
4. Hair must be well-groomed, naturally colored, and free of extreme styles (e.g., Mohawks).
5. Jewelry limited to one necklace, one bracelet or watch, and one pair of small earrings. No smartwatches or hoop earrings are allowed. (Other piercings are not permitted.)
6. If wearing a skirt or skort, solid navy, tan, or black biker/slider shorts must be worn underneath.
7. Leggings and biker shorts may not be worn as standalone bottoms.
8. Clothing that is too tight, too baggy, immodest (low-cut necklines, sheer fabric, off-the-shoulder, bare midriff, or short skirts), or damaged (ripped, torn, or frayed) is not permitted.
9. Caps, hats, bandanas, and scarves are not allowed in school.

Attendance: Regular attendance is encouraged but not required.
What: Our non-traditional multi-age level Microschool for 6-8 offers specialized academic support for homeschooled students and parents. This program takes us back to our roots as for many years we offered one & two days a week enrollment options. This class includes only Christian homeschool students and does not integrate with the Day School. We understand the challenges of homeschooling and provide encouragement, along with expert instruction in challenging subjects such as language arts and math and integrated unit studies. With our dedicated approach, we strive to empower homeschooled students and parents to achieve academic success with confidence. The Creators Microschool is a fusion of visual arts and entrepreneurship where creativity meets commerce! Students will study various visual arts techniques and artists, then apply their creative focus to marketing and planning the sales of their creations. Students will be able to explore various art media, with attention to upcycling, use of natural materials, utilization of traditional crafting methods, and innovation in current art trends. Students will also gain experience in formulating a business plan, estimating financial aspects, designing logos, branding, and marketing materials, and practicing sales techniques.
Who: Students who are homeschooling in grades 6-8 with good behavioral control, who are motivated to learn, and who have attention control that will allow them to complete work in a group setting. Students must be working at or close to grade level.
Curriculum: Creators Microschool combines art education and practice with entrepreneurial skills. These lessons build on techniques learned in class. Emphasis is given on art projects that are reproducible and conducive to sales within the structure of the class. **Book lists and supply lists will be provided by July 1.
Parent provides: Parents are responsible for core academic learning. Parents may be asked to provide recyclable items from home for use in class (cardboard, etc.)
Tuition & Fees: See current tuition & fee schedule. If you enroll for two days a week, the PEP Hybrid program is accepted, and you will be considered a part of our private school.

Champion Academy's uniform policy is designed to promote consistency, modesty, and professionalism among students. The dress code ensures that all students maintain a neat, well-groomed, and appropriate appearance without drawing unnecessary attention.

All tops must be purchased through Lands' End (www.landsend.com; School Code: 900199126).

Boys' Uniform Requirements:

- **Bottoms:** Solid navy, khaki, or black pant, joggers, or walking-length shorts (e.g., Bermuda). No pajama pants, athletic pants, sweatpants, or jogging pants.
- **Tops & Outerwear:** Solid-colored polo shirts with the school's embroidered logo are required. Solid single-colored hoodies and jackets may be worn with or without the school logo. Outerwear may not display graphics; only small brand logos are permitted.
- **Footwear:** Closed-toe and closed-heel shoes (athletic shoes preferred). Ankle or no-show socks are preferred.

Additional Guidelines for Boys:

1. All clothing must fit properly.
2. Pre-existing tattoos must be covered.
3. Hair must be well-groomed, naturally colored, and free of extreme styles (e.g., Mohawks). Facial hair is not permitted.
4. Jewelry is limited to one necklace and one bracelet or watch. No smartwatches are allowed.
5. Clothing that is too tight, too baggy, ripped, torn, or frayed is not allowed.
6. Earrings or other piercings are not permitted.
7. Caps, hats, bandanas, and scarves are not allowed in school.

Girls' Uniform Requirements:

- **Bottoms:** Solid navy, khaki, or black pants, capris, shorts, skirts, or skorts. Shorts, skirts, and skorts must be no more than four inches above the knee for all ages. No pajama pants, athletic pants, sweatpants, stand-alone leggings or yoga pants.
- **Tops & Outerwear:** Solid-colored polo shirts with the school's embroidered logo are required. Solid single-colored hoodies and jackets may be worn with or without the school logo. Outerwear may not display graphics; only small brand logos are permitted.
- **Footwear:** Closed-toe and closed-heel shoes (athletic shoes preferred). Ankle or no-show socks are preferred. Heels must not exceed 1 inch.

Cold Weather Attire (40 degrees and below): Boots may be worn in cold weather. Jeans and Sweatpants may replace uniform pants on these days.

Additional Guidelines for Girls:

1. All clothing must fit properly.
2. Pre-existing tattoos must be covered.
3. Upper-school girls may wear conservative-colored nail polish and light makeup.
4. Hair must be well-groomed, naturally colored, and free of extreme styles (e.g., Mohawks).
5. Jewelry limited to one necklace, one bracelet or watch, and one pair of small earrings. No smartwatches or hoop earrings are allowed. (Other piercings are not permitted.)
6. If wearing a skirt or skort, solid navy, tan, or black biker/slider shorts must be worn underneath.
7. Leggings and biker shorts may not be worn as standalone bottoms.
8. Clothing that is too tight, too baggy, immodest (low-cut necklines, sheer fabric, off-the-shoulder, bare midriff, or short skirts), or damaged (ripped, torn, or frayed) is not permitted.
9. Caps, hats, bandanas, and scarves are not allowed in school.
